
2018 EXPO Is A Success !

Chatting with various people (dealers, judges, attendees), this year's EXPO was another successful one! One dealer in particular, Jonathan Topper, said that the assistance he received from Alliene Franklin and his sales was the best ever!

According to the data I was given, the official attendee count was 434, a nice increase from the 375 that we had in 2017. Karen Cartier reports that the "Chance Board" sold out all of its envelopes! The Silent Auction brought in approx. \$1,900, also better than a year ago!

Our trio of APS-accredited judges (which included Jeff Shapiro & William Fort III and Chief Judge Patrick Walters) really liked the show as well, who gave a brief talk about his philatelic experiences (right). The Awards Dinner had great attendance with David Stockbridge & Alliene Franklin handing out the awards (see below). The Exhibit Palmares is elsewhere in this newsletter.

2019 Postage Rate Increases

The USPS is increasing most postage rates starting January 27, 2019. The domestic 1st ounce rate will increase to 55¢, while the "meter" rate will be 50¢ and there is actually a rate decrease: the "additional ounce" and "non-machinable" rates will decrease from 21¢ to 15¢!

Other rates, such as Priority Mail will increase.

I will have a rate chart with all the key rates in the January 2019 issue of the newsletter.

Editor's Forum

Interesting fact: 1,249 philatelic articles (not counting club-related news or announcements) is what has been published in *Stamping Around* since 1974. That's a lot of interesting reading about all sorts of topics relating to stamps, stamp collecting and other philatelic matters. And they're all available for you to download from the <https://groups.yahoo.com/neo/groups/mid-citiesstampclub/files> website (as long as you are a member of the YahooGroup).

Each month after the newsletter is done, I enter all the article names in a spreadsheet (along with author name, subject, and issue number & page). This way I can sort by all of these fields easily (and there are now 1,249 entries!). On the Webs.com site I do upload a list (but generally only sorted by issue) and I update that only once a year though. Each year I also prepare some DVD data disks containing all the newsletters in PDF file format along with the index of articles by author, article name, subject and issue. I don't want to prepare more DVD's than necessary (and it will require a PC with a DVD drive) and generally make a couple of copies to hand out. I could also provide this on a thumb drive or SD card, but you would have to provide me with that.

Even I go back occasionally and read some of the old newsletters, there are many good articles in there!

In 1979, our dues were \$4 per year. According to inflation calculators, that \$4 is now worth \$14.57! That means our \$12 annual dues are a bargain!

Thanks to Art von Reyn, who gave me a box of old club newsletters and other information, the gap in “missing newsletters” has now been reduced significantly, especially for the period 1975 to 1980 or so. Then it appears that due to the club not doing so well in the early 1980's, there were no newsletters until early 1986. So for all intents & purposes, all known copies of the club's newsletter are now available digitally!

I will be updating the *Stamping Around* philatelic article index after I've reviewed all the newly scanned old newsletters!

So for now, here is the only missing *Stamping Around* Newsletter: December 1993 (issue 12).

The first 3D movie that I remember seeing was in the early







Not only did I live in Kentucky in the past (1987 to early 1990), I also had a chance to go the famous “Kentucky Derby”, the annual internationally known horse race (which shown on the USA stamp on the left) that takes place at Churchill Downs in Louisville.

I happened to live in the City of Shelbyville (20 miles east of Louisville) at the time, a small city of about 5,000, whose main claim to fame is that it was home to “Colonel Sanders” (as of Kentucky Fried Chicken fame) and whose widow still ran a restaurant there called “[Claudia Sanders Dinner House](#)”; she has since passed away (1996), and while the restaurant had a major fire in 1999, it has reopened in a new facility.

While I was in Shelbyville, we always had foreign visitors and workers around (the company was Swiss). One time I remember taking a couple of people to the Kentucky Derby in 1988, including one of the QC people from Germany and the wife of one of the VP’s from Switzerland (see 3rd photo below). The two guys worked with me in the QC lab. Larry Page (no, NOT the one that was a founder of Google ...) who apparently won some cash from one of the races, worked with me in the lab, as did Gary (whose last name now escapes me). Larry unfortunately passed away several years ago while working for Texas Roadhouse (which is actually a company that is headquartered in Kentucky ...).

But I digress... Kentucky was a nice place to live (imagine rolling hills just outside your front door...). Unfortunately it was also heavily taxed (not just a sales tax, but also state income tax, city income tax, intangibles tax, etc), something no one told me about before I moved there! Car insurance rates were extremely expensive, and were almost triple what it cost me in Michigan! It seems that the local drivers weren’t that good (and that was in the days BEFORE cell phone distractions...). In order to qualify for reduced insurance rates, I had to join the Kentucky Farm Bureau (and luckily I didn’t have to be a famer...).

At the Kentucky Derby, one of the favorite local drinks is the “Mint Julep”, a concoction made of sugar, bourbon whiskey, water and mint leaves. For some reason, I never really took to that drink (I didn’t care for the “mint” part)... but at least I tried it.

While in Shelbyville, I also joined the “KY Riders”, a local club of touring motorcycle riders and I went on several of their “poker runs”. I even have a couple of videos of those events and had a female rider on my bike that sat backwards on the seat so that we could get some nice shots of the bikes behind us!

Sadly, in January 1990, the Swiss owners decided that the new company in Shelbyville wasn’t breaking even quickly enough and laid off about 20 some people (what I great way to start the start new decade is what I was thinking at the time...); I was the first new employee hired for that new company in late 1985 and had even gotten a good review and a raise, unfortunately in the end that didn’t matter, as they were cutting “jobs”, not people ... That’s one thing that they don’t teach you in college, things like “right-sizing”, “down-sizing”, etc.

But, I made a call to my former boss (now back in Germany) and a couple of calls and an interview later, I had a new job and a new beginning in Texas in February 1990!

And as with all “been there - done that” articles, this was another one where one stamp brought forth a bunch of memories! ..And the words just flowed at 1:35 AM as I was writing this! So what is your story behind a stamp? Please feel free to share!

Zazzle Is Back

Zazzle.com was one of the providers of USPS sanctioned "Custom Postage" products. Earlier this year, they abruptly stopped selling their Zazzle stamps.

The exact reasons are unknown, but it had something to do with the US Postal Service.

As of November 21, 2018, Zazzle is again offering custom postage, but this time as an affiliate of Stamps.com's "PhotoStamps" product (which was one of their competitors). Perhaps by being an affiliate of a company that is authorized to sell custom postage, they can do so again themselves.



Photostamp & Netstamp Changes

As you may know, stamps.com is a provider of personalized & computer vended postage.

The personalized postage product is called "PhotoStamps" and have been around since August 2004. The

stamps had 3 straight die-cut edges (top, bottom & left side) and simulated die-cut perforations on the right side. That's in addition to a printed border that was similar in nature (see the "Tuit" example to the left).

So while these *personalized postage* items (the USPS does NOT allow them to be called "stamps"! basically look like stamps, the three straight edges make them look less so.

At some point (presumably sometime in 2015), they changed the die-

cutting to have simulated perforations all the way around, so as the Mustang stamp above (the printed inside border was also dropped. Now they are looking more like "real" stamps!

The same happened to their "NetStamp" product, which comes with two types of designs: those designed by SDC (Stamps.com) and those whereby you upload a photo to them, they approve it (hopefully) and then send you a sheet of stamps on which you then print the indicia (postage value, barcode, etc).

PhotoStamps (above) only in certain denominations that meet a variety of postage rates, while Netstamps (below) can be printed by you in any number of denominations! This does require that you have an active online account with SDC. The pre-printed labels do not become postage until the indicia is printed.

Early Netstamps (such as the SDC-designed one to the left) also featured three straight edges and simulated perforations on the right side.

In February 2015, the NetStamp product also adopted simulated perforations on all four sides, such as the 1¢ version to the left shows. Now they also have the appearance of

"regular" stamps. The USPS says that only USPS-issued items can be "stamps", everything else is "postage"...



The Euro

The European Union ("EU") is an economic and political partnership of 28 countries in Europe [Editor note: England is currently voting on exiting the EU, what is referred to as "Brexit" - Britain Exit]. The Euro is the monetary unit of nineteen of those countries: Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia and Spain. In addition, Andorra, Kosovo, Monaco, Montenegro, San Marino and the Vatican City also use the Euro as their currency.

Up until the Euro was adopted, each country had their own currency. For example, France had the "(French) Franc", Germany the "(Deutsche) Mark" (also known as the "DMark"), Spain the "Peseta", Austria the "Schilling" and so on. Each time when you crossed a border you had to exchange your money for the local currency. Now when you travel between these countries, there is no need to stop at a bank [Editor: or post office or train station] to exchange your money, a process whereby you invariably lose money due to the "buy" and "sell" prices for each currency (and possibly "exchange fees" imposed by the financial institution). Now you can simply continue using your Euros in the next country!



In the pictures above are the front and back of the €5 and €20 Euro notes plus various coins left over from our vacation last year to the Balkans.

The stamps shown at top right are Italy Scott #2473a+b, issued on January 2, 2002 when Italy switched over to the Euro. The left stamp shows the symbol of the Euro which is "€" and the flags of the initial countries that switched to the Euro. The right stamp shows an Italian "Lira" coin and the one the €1 coin.

[Editor note: you can type the € symbol on your computer keyboard by holding down the "ALT" key and then pressing the following keys on the numeric pad in order: 0, 1, 2, 8].

The souvenir sheet shown in the second column is Slovenia Scott #703, issued on January 1, 2007 when Slovenia started using the Euro.
