Jeanette Hodges is the Sales & Service Associate for the United States Postal Service. She works the retail window counter at the Ft. Worth downtown station located 251 West Lancaster Avenue, Ft. Worth, Texas, 76102. Jeanette has been with the US Postal Service for the past 48 years!

If you are having difficulty finding any of the many new stamps that the USPS issues each year, Jeanette is the person to see. She stocks all of the new stamps with the exception of souvenir sheets which can only be ordered through Kansas City. If you only need one stamp of a new issue, she will sell it to you. There are no minimums like Kansas City requires. However, booklets, coils and some sheets cannot be broken. She also carries the flag definitives from the different printers, as well as the new \$1, \$2 and \$5 stamps.

If you collect the Migratory Bird Hunting stamps, also known as the "Duck Hunting Stamps", you may want to pay a visit to Jeanette. She also has them in stock.

Jeanette is also a stamp collector. She started collecting US singles when she went to work for the post office, and now collects US commemorative plate blocks.

The retail window counter at the Ft. Worth downtown station is open Monday through Friday, 9 AM to 6 PM and Saturday from 8 AM to 4 PM. The phone number is (817) 870-8104.

The stamp shown is USA Scott #1489 (part of a set of 10) that was issued on April 30, 1973. It pictures a postal clerk selling stamps to a customer.

Zazzle Status

Zazzle.com began offering USPS authorized “custom postage” again on November 19, 2018 after a 6-month hiatus from postage stamp sales [shh..., the USPS says that they are not allowed to be referred to as “US stamps” - they should be referred to as “customized postage”...] that started on May 15. So I decided to order a couple of sheets.



The first order was for a 35¢ “Remember When The Web Was Just Spun” stamp, a design I had previously used.

This time I colorized the design, but while it looks great on my computer screen, the problem is that the yellow block at the top with the reversed white text just doesn’t look as good when printed on paper as opposed to viewing on a backlit computer monitor...

In any case, I got the order delivered without any problems (see scan above of one of the actual stamps). As you can see, the stamps are actually printed by provider “Stamps.com” while “Customized by Zazzle” is printed as a byline for the affiliate Zazzle on the left edge (which significantly reduces the area left for your photo or design).



Then I decided to order two more stamps with the designs shown above. The above are screen shots from the order confirmation. About a week to 10 days later, Zazzle informed me that the order had been cancelled due to one stamp not meeting their “guidelines for content”.

Can you guess which of the two stamps above didn’t pass muster? It was the “Shift Happens” stamp. I mean, to me it’s obvious: it shows a manual stick shift gear pattern and when you “row your own gears” (as car guys tend to call it...), then, well, “shift happens”, right? Apparently they must have thought that there was an ulterior motive in my design, in that perhaps this is too close to another phrase that doesn’t have the “f” in “shift”... Get my drift? ... Hey, that rhymes! Ooh, and “drift” is another car-related term... Man, I’m must be on a roll here.... Oh, wait, roll is what car tires do... [A note to aspiring philatelic authors: see how much fun it is to create philatelic articles?].



Usually in the past, when placing an order with Zazzle for multiple items, the

entire order is canceled, even for those stamps that are ok.

So I thought, “what a bummer”. A week or so later, I received the “HAUDI!” stamp sheet in the mail (see scan to the left). That was a pleasant surprise. The stamp does somewhat differ from the online image in that the typical Zazzle font of the denomination is different than the Stamps.com font on the actual stamp, and the serial number is not centered below the box.

I checked my credit card online, but didn’t see any charges from Zazzle for this 2nd order (just the first one for the 35¢ Spider stamp). This is quite puzzling. Since Zazzle now does not print their own stamps any more and apparently passes on the order to Stamps.com for censoring & printing (as Zazzle now simply appears to be an “affiliate” of Stamps.com for purposes of being able to print customized postage), and that something must have gone awry between the two companies’ computer systems when passing information about items that passed scrutiny or not. I was going to test that theory again, but then Zazzle shut down custom postage production again after just 23 days on December 12, 2018!



This time, it is because of an accusation by another Zazzle customer that Stamps.com denied her image of their family standing in front of St. Basil’s cathedral in Russia (while also holding a sports-related banner) and that it is unconstitutional to ban “religious” content (i.e.: the cathedral in the background) on customized postage, stating that “regular” US Postage Stamps do feature “religious” content (i.e.: USPS Christmas stamps with Madonna & Child, Hanukah & Kwanzaa).

This seems like a “double standard” to me! And I personally don’t equate that picture as being “religious content”. But then now they’re saying that banner that they are holding is “unauthorized usage of the Kansas City Chiefs” logo, but backed off when those in the photo proved they owned it.

While personally I’ve been buying both Zazzle and Stamps.com [PhotoStamps] over the years, I’ve always liked Zazzle better since they offered 3 different size stamps in landscape and portrait formats, and with image areas that were either square or rectangular plus the ability to add text, while Stamps.com only offers through itself and its affiliates only one stamp size and the image area is approximately square (very slightly portrait).

I guess we’ll see what happens going forward! Many thanks to Otto Bergman for providing me with info & links to some of this information.

Ljubljana, Slovenia

On our recent trip to the Balkans, one of the places we visited was the capital city of Slovenia: Ljubljana. Slovenia is the northernmost of the former Yugoslav republics. It is situated just south of Austria and to the east of Italy.

In 1278, Slovenia came under the rule of the Habsburgs, which were the royal family of Austria. That rule continued until the end of World War I, except for a brief period from 1809 to 1815 when Slovenia was under the control of the French.

After the defeat of the Austro-Hungarian Empire in World War I, Slovenia joined with Croatia, Dalmatia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Serbia and Montenegro to form the new nation of the Serbs, Croats and Slovenes, later changing the name to Yugoslavia.

When the second World War ended in 1945, the communists, under Marshall Jozep Broz Tito, took control of Yugoslavia. On June 25, 1991, Slovenia, along with Croatia, declared their independence from Yugoslavia.

In the picture below, I am standing outside of the main post office in Ljubljana where I bought the stamps shown above, Scott #1240 issued on November 10, 2017.

The stamp shown is Slovenia Scott #552; it was issued on March 24, 2004. It commemorates the 1,000 year anniversary of the town of Bled. It shows a beautiful picture of Lake Bled, a resort area north of Ljubljana, the capital of Slovenia, where we were staying. It is close to the border of Austria. Obviously the picture used for the stamp was taken on a bright sunny day.

I did not have that kid of luck. The day I was there, it was cold with a steady downpour of rain.

The island in the middle of the lake was enclosed in a most, so it was impossible to get a picture of it even though it wasn't that far away. Because of the rain, Pan and about half of our tour group stayed back at the



hotel in Ljubljana. We were supposed to go by boat out to the island to see the Pilgrimage Church of the Assumption of Maria, but the water was too choppy, so the tour was cancelled. Our tour guide took us to a hotel overlooking the lake instead and treated us to coffee and hot chocolate.

The picture that I am enclosing is of the 11th century Bled Castle that sits on a cliff overlooking Lake Bled. Notice that the street lights and the lights on the car are on. It was a cold, dark, wet and dreary day.







USPS "Forever" Stamps

The comic strip above asks the question of whether "FOREVER" stamps last forever. That statement can be taken one of two ways: 1) The "value" of the FOREVER stamps supposedly will forever be whatever the current base 1st class postage rate is. 2) I take this to have another meaning. In the first panel, it states whether will they "last" forever. To me that implies will they "physically" last forever!

So, take a look at the "Celebrate" FOREVER ATM block of 4 stamps (3 stamps + 1 VOID label) from a USPS "APC" (Automated Postal Center) machine. These are Scott #CVP86 (which includes 6 different designs) and were first used in early April 2012 and were used through late 2013 (example below). As you can see, on the left column, the fading is getting severe where the small text at the bottom is almost completely faded, and "FOREVER" is fading rapidly as well. Being less than 6 years old, I don't think these will last FOREVER! Thermal "printing" was just not designed to be "forever". Will these still be accepted as postage when all that is left is a white label with a pink stripe?



Attendance:

- There were 13 members present.

- **Secretary** – Skip Ely said we had three new members and one deceased, giving us a total of 103 members. But he said about 40 members had yet to renew their membership, so our numbers may change.

He noted that priority mail postage was increasing the end of this month, so he was looking at ways to take some of the club excess stamps and offering them to club members at heavily discounted prices.
- **Newsletter** – Peter Elias said the next newsletter was almost completed. He said that the APS has discontinued their annual APS Chapter newsletter competition, but he is still looking for interesting contributions from members.
- **Website** – Jim Myers said he was working with one of Evan's staff members on revising parts of the club website.

Announcements:

- Stanley Christmas said there would be an EXPO meeting on Saturday, January 26 at a location to be announced.
- Mike Smith said this would be his last attendance at a meeting, as he was moving to Oregon next Monday. He said he hoped to return for an EXPO or two in the future.

Show & Tell:

- Tom Turner showed a cigar advertisement cover from 1908 he had recently purchased.
- Ken Wills showed a wine bottle that he received from his son with a label making an extensive case for stamp collecting.
- Peter Elias showed a very nice book about the Seebeck stamps he had printed from an eBook file sent to him by the author. This eBook is free for the asking. He also showed a priority mail envelope with tracking that was delivered to the to the right mailbox but the USPS had set their scanning equipment up for the wrong zip code.
- Judy Christmas had some updated club business cards she had acquired from Peter.
- Stanley Christmas showed a nice Christmas card from the Oklahoma Philatelic Society Sales Division.
- Jim Myers had a large 1940 Christmas Seals postcard to show.
- Rick Howell showed a beautiful Netherlands catalog he had created with detailed information about the countries stamps to help him with sorting and identifying those stamps.
- Skip Ely showed a 2017 Canadian Unitrade catalog he had recently purchased.

Door Prizes:

- Gift Certificates were won by Tom Turner and Rick Howell.

Adjournment:

- The meeting adjourned about 8:45 PM.

On September 6, 2000, Annie & I were in Hall, which is in the Tyrol region of Austria, a couple of miles east of the capitol city of Tyrol, Innsbruck. Hall is a small city of about 13,000 and was one of the most important towns in the Habsburg Empire in the 15th & 16th century. The town dates back to the early 1200's and salt mining was an important industry.

In 1477, the town got the right of coinage, and a mint was established there. In the 16th century, the mint introduced the first automated coining machine, a reproduction of which can be seen in the museum in the Burg Hasegg (the entrance to the museum is shown in the photo to the right).



As part of the admission fee, we got a “copper slug”, which we used to mint our own reproduction coin, the front and back of which are shown above. For an extra fee, they also sold silver slugs. The 1486 reproduction coin itself is about the size of a US quarter.

So, what does all of this have to do with Thalers and Dollars? Well, they called their currency the “Thaler”, which is got anglicized to the English word Dollar!

The Castle of Hall was featured on Austria Scott #624 issued in 1960 shown below and on the first day cover to the right. It was also featured on an older German postal stationery card (inset at lower right), as Hall was a part of Germany at the time (the

inscription above the card's photo says “Get To Know Germany”. If you ever go to Austria, this is a great town to visit! We stayed at the Garden Hotel Maria Theresia, which I can highly recommend!


